Stand by Me – August 27th

Rob Reiner – USA - 1986

The Stephen King adaptation *Stand by Me* is a warm and melancholic film about four boys who set out on a seemingly simple trip to find the body of a missing boy. The powerful performances by River Phoenix and Wil Wheaton make it a deeply moving experience—you will both sob and laugh yourself silly. “If I could only have one food to eat for the rest of my life? That’s easy. PEZ. Cherry flavor PEZ. No question about it.”



Team Hurricane – August 27th

Annika Berg – Danmark - 2017

A highly stylized and punk coming-of-age film that mixes fiction and documentary: loneliness, “pussy-power”, Kawaii, electric green, hentai, graffiti, vibrators, friendship, teddy bears, “resting bitch face”, ART, fire, fear, bubblegum, mom and dad, anorexia, cacti, homemade piercings, nail art, cherries, self-harm, dolphins, Lolita, secret diaries, and daydreaming. It Happened One Night – September 17th

Frank Capra – USA - 1934

It Happened One Night is one of Hollywood's great screwball comedies—sharp, charming, and full of witty dialogue. Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert are in top form as a journalist and a runaway heiress, respectively, who meet on a night bus from Miami to New York. She has fled from her father, who annulled her marriage, and the journalist senses a great high-society story. Forced together on the journey, they—of course—gradually and reluctantly fall in love with each other.



Tampopo – September 24th

Jūzō Itami – Japan - 1985

"Ramen Western". In this humorous tribute to the joy of food, two truck drivers end up at a rundown roadside shop serving ramen noodles. The owner, Tampopo, asks for their help to transform the place into a prime example of a ramen establishment. Itami's films are often warm and playful, finding humor in ordinary things. Tampopo is no exception and is a feel-good comedy of the highest quality.



Let the Right One In – October 22nd

Thomas Alfredson – Sverige - 2008

Twelve-year-old Oskar is lonely and bullied at school. When a mysterious girl moves in next door, an unexpected friendship forms between the two. But Eli is not quite like other children. *La den rette komme inn* is a blend of horror, love story, and coming-of-age, and is a surprisingly touching film about loneliness, friendship, and the need to belong.



Frankenstein – October 22nd

James Whale – USA - 1931

Mary Shelley's gothic masterpiece has been filmed countless times, but no version beats the one by Englishman James Whale. *Frankenstein* (1931) is one of the great classics of horror cinema, featuring Boris Karloff in one of the most iconic roles of all time as the monster. The film is dark and gothic, yet deeply human and thought-provoking.



Wives – October 23rd

Anja Breien – Noreg - 1975

Heidrun, Kaja, and Mie, three adult friends from their school days, meet again at a high school reunion. The party is over, but the women keep the celebration going. They head out on the town to find themselves, leaving their domestic duties to look after themselves. Anja Breien got the idea for the film after watching John Cassavetes' *Husbands* (1970).



Deliverance – October 24th

John Boorman – USA - 1972

Four city dwellers want to experience canoeing in wild, untouched nature and paddle through dangerous rapids in a river destined to disappear due to a dam project. The outdoor adventure gradually turns into a test of manhood of far more nightmarish proportions than they could have ever imagined. The four have not only challenged themselves, but also nature and the local population.



Amarcord – November 19th

Federico Fellini – Italia - 1973

In an Italian coastal town, young Titta gets into trouble along with his friends while observing local eccentrics expressing themselves in often absurd situations. He frequently clashes with his strict father but is defended by his devoted mother. He witnesses the antics of a wide array of characters—from his extended family and fascist sympathizers to voluptuous women—where certain moments drift into imaginative, dreamlike scenarios.



Howl's Moving Castle – December 17th

Hayao Miyazaki – Japan - 2004

Sophie, a young hatmaker, is turned into an old woman by a witch. On her journey to undo the curse, she encounters a handsome wizard, a fat witch, a fire demon, a short-breathed dog, a brutal war, a little love, and a roaming, moving castle! This is one of Hayao Miyazaki's most acclaimed films, and for good reason. *Howl's Moving Castle* is full of imagination and ideas, and like most Ghibli films, it is richly detailed and colorful.

ABOUT VOLDA FILM CLUB

Volda Film Club was started in September 2025 and aims to bring together the residents of Volda for good film experiences with social and cultural elements, and across generations from 15 years of age and up.

Volda is nationally known as the media village, with education in media and film at both high school and college. At the same time, there are very few offerings that create meeting places across generations for media and film enthusiasts in the village. We want to do something about that!

Volda film club is a non-profit organization affiliated with the Norwegian Film Club Association. We collaborate with Volda film theater on screenings. The extended board and program council for Volda film club include members from the youth club in Volda, Volda secondary school, students, employees and pensioners at the University of Volda. We want to invite you to experience and discuss films that are not shown in regular cinemas, and that have had historical and cultural significance both locally, nationally and internationally.

MEMBERSHIP AND SEASON TICKETS

Membership is free, but you must be a member to watch Volda Film Club's films. You register at filmklubbmedlem.no/registerer.

- You buy tickets in the normal way at the Volda Film Theatre website: voldafilmteater.no/volda-filmklubb
- If you want a single ticket, you pay NOK 110 per screening. If you have a **season ticket**, you "buy" a free ticket.
- **NOTE!** Even if you have a **season ticket**, you must book a seat in the cinema by "buying" a free ticket.
- With a **season ticket**, you get to see all films in the current season for free, it costs NOK 500 for adults and NOK 250 for students. Young people who are schoolchildren over 15 years old get a free season ticket.
- Buy a **season ticket** through VIPPS number #30985.

Since we are a relatively new film club, we hope that as many people as possible will buy **season tickets!**
